Since 2002, Lava Lake and its partners have been at the forefront of the effort to develop and implement approaches that minimize conflicts between wolves and livestock. In 2008, we helped form the Wood River Wolf Project, a groundbreaking collaboration between ranchers, land managers, and conservationists. We are delighted that The Nature Conservancy, one of our premier conservation partners, in conjunction with the Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum, selected Lava Lake Ranch as one of only ten projects worldwide (and one of only three in North America) for their stunning Design for a Living World exhibit. The section on organic wool rug tiles, the artistic creation of the Dutch designer Christien Meindertsma, is fascinating. The Ranch is featured in this short [exhibit video](#). The Cooper Hewitt is part of the Smithsonian Institution. The Design for a Living World exhibit was originally mounted in the Andrew Carnegie mansion on Fifth Avenue in New York City.
